UPDATE #11 COVID-19

March 17, 2020 (6:30 PM)

The health and well-being of our residents remains the top priority for your Bal Harbour Village government. The Village Emergency Operations Team continues to monitor the situation relative to COVID-19 (Coronavirus), and is taking action on additional measures required to ensure the safety and welfare of the community.

Today, Miami-Dade County issued Executive Order #03-20 which limits or closes many establishments in Miami-Dade County effective at 11:00 p.m. on March 17, 2020. As a result, the Village Manager issued Update #1 to the restrictions issued on March 16, 2020. Effective March 17, 2020 at 11:00 p.m., all bars must close until further notice, and restaurants and food establishments shall close all dine in service of customers. Delivery services, pick up or take out services provided by any restaurant are permitted. A copy of the updated restrictions is included in this update.

Following is the status of Village services:

- Bal Harbour Shuttle service is discontinued until further notice;
- Bal Harbour Park, Recreation Center and basketball courts are closed until further notice;
- All recreation programming is cancelled until further notice, including the Warriors Basketball Program, Family Excursions, Movie in the Park events and the Bal Harbour 5K Run/Walk;
- The Bal Harbour Jetty is closed for fishing until further notice.

Information from the Florida Department of Health

If you think you have been exposed to COVID-19 and develop a fever and symptoms, such as cough or difficulty breathing, the Florida Department of Health (DOH) recommends the following in order to be tested:

- Call the DOH Epidemiology Department at (305) 470-5660 for guidance, or
- Contact your primary care physician, explain your symptoms and whether or not you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 over the past 14 days, or
- Contact an urgent care facility or hospital emergency room, explain your symptoms and whether or not you have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 over the past 14 days.

UPDATE #1 - MARCH 17, 2020

To All Condominium, Hotel and Commercial Property Managers:


On March 13, 2020, I declared a state of emergency for Bal Harbour Village as authorized by Chapter 252.38(3)(a), Florida Statutes, and Bal Harbour Village Code Chapter 2, Article VIII "Emergency Management" in response to COVID-19 (Coronavirus).

Pursuant to this Declaration and Miami-Dade County Order No.03-20, further orders may be issued to protect the health, safety, and welfare of Bal Harbour Village. **As such, the following updated restrictions are effective March 17, 2020 at 11 PM:**

1. All bars must close until further notice.
2. Restaurants and food establishments shall close all dine in service of customers. Establishments may operate their kitchens for the purpose of providing delivery service, and employees, janitorial personnel, contractors and delivery personnel shall be allowed access to such establishment. Delivery services, pick up or take out services provided by any restaurant are permitted.
3. All gymnasiums and spas will be closed until further notice.
4. Social gathering rooms may be utilized only when proper sanitation and spacing requirements are met, including 50% capacity and six (6) foot separation.
5. Common areas, including elevators, must be properly sanitized and maintained on a frequent basis.
6. Pool and lounge area furniture should not exceed 50% of normal capacity, and must be located at a minimum six (6) foot distance between each other in order to conform with social distancing.
7. Bal Harbour Beach remains opens. Private properties may not deploy beach furniture onto the public beach until further notice. Residents may bring their personal beach chairs for their use.
8. The Bal Harbour Jetty is closed for fishing until further notice.

Pursuant to the powers vested in me as the Village Manager, these rules are necessary for the safety and welfare of Bal Harbour Village, and must be adhered to under criminal penalty of State Statutes.

The above issued restrictions shall remain in force until further notice.

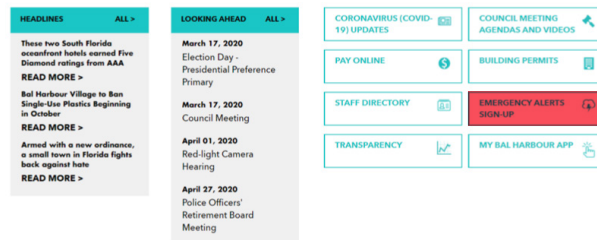

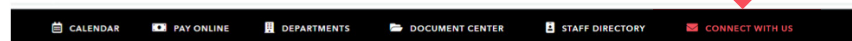
