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Weekly Summary Report

Weekly Code Enforcement Efforts

COMMENTS:

Code Enforcement Officers investigated an allegation of an illegal fence on the 200 Block of Bal Bay. A resident complained that a neighbor installed a wooden lattice-style fence on her property. CEOs determined the fencing was obviously on the complainant's property and issued a code violation warning to the offending party with a specific date to correct the violation. CEOs will monitor the case to ensure the illegal fencing is removed within the allotted time.

Code Enforcement Officers also assisted the Patrol Division with the High Holidays details.

Criminal Investigations

COMMENTS:

Detectives responded to the Bellini Condominium and conducted a follow-up investigation regarding a burglary. Detectives were able to identify and arrest the primary individual responsible for the crime. Detectives are currently pursuing leads into the identity and apprehension of the other accomplices.

COMMENTS:

Officers were summoned to the Bellini condominium regarding three unauthorized males on the property. The males were observed by security personnel entering the property through the beach access gate. When the males were approached by security, they fled the property through the beach access. Review of surveillance footage observed one of the males entering the building and removing three key fobs from the valet box. Bal Harbour investigators were able to identify the male that entered the building as a former employee who was recently terminated. Investigators located and arrested the male.

COMMENTS:

Officers were summoned to the Le Zoo restaurant regarding a theft. The victim told officers he parked his vehicle on the fourth level of the parking garage prior to his shift. Upon his return, he discovered his vehicle license plate missing. There are no security cameras in the area and the case was forwarded to the Criminal Investigations Division for a follow-up investigation.

Officers were summoned to the Collins Avenue corridor regarding a male in the roadway. Officers located the male in the median area picking up rocks and speaking to them. No injuries or damages were reported.

COMMENTS:

Bal Harbour Police personnel continued their proactive measures to maintain the safety of the community throughout the culmination of the High Holidays. Personnel were assigned to various traffic and high visibility posts throughout the Village to assist with pedestrian traffic and enhanced police presence. Bal Harbour officers also conducted directed patrols at the Bal Harbour Shul and Young Israel Temple. No incidents were reported.

COMMENTS:

Bal Harbour police officers encountered two females suspected of a theft at the Balenciaga store. The females were questioned; however, no theft was confirmed, they were subsequently trespassed from the Bal Harbour Shops property. A short time later, the Bal Harbour officer working the extra duty detail observed one of the females back on the property. The female fled the area on foot but was quickly apprehended. The female was arrested and transported to the Miami-Dade County Jail.
